ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

SB710/HB849 Companies required to have a delivery service license.

Sponsors: Sen. Stevens, John, Rep. Tillis, Rick

Summary: Clarifies that technology services companies that provide software to connect retail licensees with consumers for the delivery of

alcoholic beverages is required to have a delivery service license.

COMMERCIAL LAW

SB239/HB121 Prohibits used tire suppliers from installing unsafe tires on motor vehicles.

Sponsors: Sen. Gilmore, Brenda, Rep. Stewart, Mike

Summary: Prohibits suppliers of used tires from installing used tires that are deemed unsafe on motor vehicles. Defines unsafe used tire and

creates \$500 penalty for violation of the Tennessee Consumer Protection Act of 1977.

Summary: Decriminalizes, under certain circumstances, wagers on fantasy sports leagues and sports pools.

SB706/HB579 Report on status of broadband accessibility grant program.

Summary: Requires the department of economic and community development to deliver its report on the status of grants under the broadband

accessibility grant program to the chairs of the commerce committee of the house and the commerce and labor committee of the

senate. Broadly captioned.

SB989/HB1025 Requires report on grants distributed.

accessibility grant program to the chairs of the finance, ways and means committees. Broadly captioned.

SB1115/HB1223 Job skills program - annual report.

Summary: Requires annually report to office of legislative budget analysis in addition to senate and house finance, ways and means

committees regarding the job skills program. Broadly captioned.

EDUCATION

SB52/HB289 Award for first four courses taken under dual enrollment grant.

Sponsors: Sen. Southerland, Steve , Rep. Hawk, David

Summary: Requires the Tennessee Student Assistance Corporation (TSAC) award \$500 for the first four courses taken under a dual enrollment

grant. Requires TSAC to determine award course hour for courses five through eight, that cannot exceed the cost per credit hour at

state community colleges. The act will apply to students applying for dual enrollment grants for the 2019-2020 school year.

SB63/HB866 Expands career and technical education programs to middle school students.

Summary: Expands career and technical education to grades six through twelve,. Program must be available to all students in grades six

through twelve, with the program serving at least 50% of those students. Requires board of career and technical education to plan

facilities for comprehensive career and technical training for middle school students.

SB477/HB1084 Surveying of students by LEAs.

Summary: Requires LEAs to survey students about the availability of internet access in their homes and report results to the department of

education. Requires reporting of the results to the governor and the education committees of both legislative bodies.

SB504/HB559 Authorizes LEA's to offer internship programs.

Summary: Authorizes LEA's to offer internship programs for elective credits in the high school curriculum which must be a minimum of six

weeks and may be offered during the summer or the school year.

SB670/HB802 Alternative graduation pathways for public high school students.

Summary: Requires the state board of education, in consultation with the department of education, THEC, and the board of regents of the state

university and community college system, to develop and adopt two alternative graduation pathways for public high school students, one designated the college preparatory track and one designated the technology track, to be implemented in all public high schools

beginning with the 2020-2021 school year.

SB764/HB1425 Courses taken under a dual enrollment grant.

Summary: Increases the number of additional courses a high school student may enroll in at an eligible postsecondary institution from one to

two classes if requirements are met. Establishes that a student who receives a dual enrollment grant cannot enroll in more than 10

courses if the grant was provided by the net proceeds of the state lottery.

SB773/HB1310 Tennessee Higher Education Commission.

Summary: Changes the date by which the department of labor and workforce development must provide data on the state's anticipated

workforce needs and other information to the commission from October 1 to October 31 of each year.

SB801/HB945 Report on career and technical programs in agriculture, food, and natural resources.

Summary: Requires the department to submit an annual report to the education committees of both houses on school districts that offer a

career and technical education program in agriculture, food, and natural resources, and on students enrolled in the program.

SB805/HB949 Changes to dual enrollment grant program.

Summary: Clarifies the requirements for a high school student who is also enrolled in an eligible postsecondary institution to receive for a dual

enrollment grant. Requires application for the grant to be done the year they are planning on attending. Declares it the intent of the general assembly that the award for the first four dual enrollment courses attempted by students enrolled in a certificate or diploma

program annually identified by TSAC's board of directors only provides for maintenance fees at the institution attended.

SB977/HB1199 Eligibility for the Wilder-Naifeh technical skills grant.

institutions and who are otherwise eligible for such grants.

Summary: Replaces the economic and community development department with the higher education commission as the state agency charged

with administering work-based learning programs grants.

SB1283/HB1316 Study on economic feasibility of creating and utilizing statewide comprehensive energy policy.

Summary: Removes from code language regarding a study on the economic feasibility of creating and utilizing a statewide comprehensive

energy policy, the final report of which was due by December 15, 2014. Broadly captioned.

SB1379/HB745 Increases middle college scholarship.

Summary: Increases the Tennessee Middle College Scholarship from \$600 to \$1,000 for full-time attendance for each semester.

SB1380/HB742 Defines awards for dual enrollment grants.

awards for fifth through eighth courses taken. Orders that TSAC must not award an amount per credit hour that exceeds the cost per

credit hour of courses taken at community colleges in the state university and community college system.

ENTERTAINMENT

SB16/HB1 Authorizes sports betting in certain jurisdictions.

Sponsors: Sen. Akbari, Raumesh , Rep. Staples, Rick

Summary: Authorizes sports betting in Tennessee in jurisdictions that approve sports betting by local option election. Imposes a ten percent tax

on gaming revenue. Distributes 40 percent of the tax to the general fund for general appropriations, 30 percent to Tennessee colleges of applied technologies and community colleges for equipment and capital projects, and 30 percent to local governments for education and infrastructure. Establishes the Tennessee gaming commission to regulate sports betting and authorizes the

commission to collaborate with the TBI for purposes of enforcement.

SB172/HB495 Redefines player in fantasy sports contests.

Summary: Redefines player in fantasy sports as a natural person or individual participating in fantasy sports contests.

SB1055/HB666 Sports Wagering For Stronger Schools Act.

Sponsors: Sen. Dickerson, Steven, Rep. Staples, Rick

Summary: Creates the Tennessee sports wagering commission to be administratively attached to the department of tourism and specifies

membership and duties of commission. Authorizes sports wagering, including online sports wagering. Levies a privilege tax of ten percent on the gross sports wagering revenue of each operator for the privilege of being an operator. Requires each operator to remit the privilege tax department of revenue and specifies that the tax revenue collected pursuant to this section is earmarked and allocated specifically for pre-kindergarten through twelfth grade education and must be deposited in the education trust fund of 1992. Allows a municipality by ordinance, to levy a privilege tax of up to two percent on the gross sports wagering revenue generated from

wagers placed at a physical sports book located within the municipality's corporate boundaries. (22 pp.)

SB1463/HB1012 Requires a study on sports gaming.

Summary: Requires the secretary of state and comptroller of treasury to conduct a study of the economic impact of sports gaming in this state if

it were legalized. Orders the study to include an overview of the economic impact of sports gaming in other states in which sports gaming is legal. The findings of the report must be reported to the state and local government committee of the senate and the state

government committee of the house of representatives no later than January 15, 2020. Broadly captioned.

Requires the department to report on its findings and recommendations, along with any legislative or executive actions needed, no

later than December 31, 2019.

SB967/HB1434 Liability for injuries incurred by minors using dockless electric scooters.

Summary: Imposes strict liability on a company doing business in this state for the purpose of providing dockless electric scooter rentals for

injuries incurred by minors using the company's electric scooters.

SB34/HB10 Prospective Employee Credit Information Privacy Act.

Summary: Enacts the "Prospective Employee Credit Information Privacy Act," which prohibits an employer from failing or refusing to recruit or

interview a prospective employee with respect to employment based on that person's credit information. Establishes a private cause

of action for persons injured due to violations by employers.

SB461/HB273 Save Tennessee Call Center Jobs Act of 2019.

Summary: Requires employers intending to relocate call centers to foreign countries give 120 days notice before relocation, compiles lists of

relocating call centers, restricts relocating employers from grants, indirect state grants, state-guaranteed loans, or tax credits or refunds for five years and requires these employers remit the unamortized value of any governmental support it has previously

received to the commissioner.

SB489/HB821 Providing of broadband internet by municipalities.

Summary: Authorizes each municipality operating an electric plant to have the ability to provide telecommunication and broadband services,

either on its own or by joint ventures, within the electric plant's service area. Defines a broadband service as one with wireline access

to the internet of speeds at least 25 Mbps, download transmission at 25 Mbps, and upload transmission at 25 Mbps.

SB494/HB819 Requires additional authorization to provide internet outside a service area.

telephone cooperative in whose territory the system will provide broadband, internet, and related services.

SB1037/HB580 Limit or expenses incurred by the department of economic and community development to administer the broadband accessibility grant program.

Summary: Reduces the limit at which the expenses incurred by the department of economic and community development to administer the

broadband accessibility grant program must not exceed from the total amount appropriated to the program in any fiscal year from

five to four percent.

SB407/HB404 Assessing authority for telecommunications tower properties.

Summary: Specifies that the comptroller of the treasury is the assessing authority for telecommunications tower properties that are owned by a

public utility company.

SB485/HB805 Adds to the definition of sport or recreational equipment for tax purposes.

Summary: Adds to the definition of "sport or recreation equipment" by including that it is equipment designed for use in electronic sports, also

known as esports for clarification in what is applicable for taxation.

SB787/HB931 Delays effective date of streamlined sales tax provision.

SB576/HB192 Immunity for civil liability for local governments for certain software.

Summary: Establishes that a person does not have a cause of action against a local government, officers, employees, or agents of a local

government for any defect or malfunction in a software program intended to register a non-communicative person with law enforcement when the program was designed in good faith and without cost to the recipient local government or user of the program.

Provides exception to immunity for claims based on gross negligence, willful misconduct, or bad faith.

Summary: Authorizes municipal electric plants to provide internet and other services outside its service area. Broadly captioned.

SB210/HB172 Rural electric and community services cooperatives - board of directors.

Summary: Increases the amount of time members of a cooperative have to return ballots to elect directors of the cooperative by mail from three

to five business days.

SB426/HB376 Costs related to replacement of or upgrades to usage measurement devices.

Summary: Authorizes a public utility to request and the Tennessee Public Utility Commission to authorize a mechanism to recover the

operational expenses, capital costs, or both, related to replacement of or upgrades to usage measurement devices if found by the

commission to be in the public interest. Broadly captioned.

SB490/HB820 Specifies that applicants for state-issued certificates of authority satisfy requirements if they provide 1,000 customers fiber-to-the-premises.

Summary: Specifies that an applicants for state-issued certificates of authority shall be deemed by the regulatory authority to have satisfied all of

the requirements necessary for approval of a state-issued certificate of franchise authority if the applicant has provided fiber-to-the-

premises to at least 1,000 customers for a period of at least one year prior to the application.

SB526/HB1149 Selling or sharing of electronically captured data by a utility.

Summary: Prohibits a utility, utility district, utility service, or utility system from selling, sharing, or disclosing information generated, provided, or

otherwise collected from an advanced metering system or meter information network, including, but not limited to, information used to calculate charges for service, historical load data, or any other customer information, to a third party unless the information is

aggregated in such a way so as not to identify individual customers or properties.

driver being under the influence of drugs or alcohol during a trip from 24 months to 30 months.
